



Grading Practices

Subject(s): Chemistry/AP Chemistry

Grade Level: 10-12

Homework

Homework will be used for practice to monitor student progress and drive instruction. If a student does not turn in homework. It must be turned in the next class period for a late grade. If homework is reviewed during the class period it is due, not late assignments will be accepted.

Late Work

All late work will receive an automatic 10% point deduction. Any approved missing assignment must be completed and turned in before the last week of the grading period.

Explanation of Zeroes

Zeros only exist in the gradebook if it represents a student's level of achievement (zero correct). Missing work will be entered as MI. MI will be associated with a default score of zero, to be replaced once the assignments have been completed during the time frame allotted by the teacher.

Reassessment

Students who receive a 75% or below on a graded assignment may be given an opportunity for additional instruction and reassessment provided that the student has:

- Participated in class
- Completed assignments
- Demonstrated evidence of the best effort on the assessment and the learning leading up to the assignment

Students must demonstrate mastery prior to retakes. Retakes must be completed within one week of when the assignment is graded and returned to the student (tests will never leave the classroom). Students with chronic patterns of missing work will be referred to their school counselor or the SRT.

Make-up Work

In the event of an absence, the student should check the Google Classroom for their class period before returning to class. All missed work must be completed within a week of the students return unless administrative approval is needed for extenuating circumstances. Students must schedule a time to make up tests a quizzes after school or during a study block within one week of their absence.

Extra Credit

If, or when, extra credit is given it will be content based only.
