Grade Level: 9-12

Homework

Homework will be used for practice, to monitor student progress and to drive instruction. It will be purposeful and relevant. Practicing your music is your daily homework. There will also be homework in the form of worksheets, written work, studying for a test, research, listening to music and creating a project.

Late Work

A student submitting late work will receive a 10% grade reduction on the assignment.
All late work must be submitted by the next class period.

Explanation of Zeroes

A zero may be given for academic failure or student failure to submit work due. The grade in the gradebook will distinguish between missing assignments (MI), incomplete assignments (I) and failure (0 answers correct).

Reassessment

Graded assignments are eligible for a redo or retake without academic penalty with the exception of scheduled rehearsals, concerts, and performances. These events may at the discretion of the director based on reason for absence may be replaced by an alternative assignment.

Redoing or retaking a singing or written test: A student may retake an assessment if they have not shown mastery. Mastery is considered at a score of 80 (2.7) or higher. Student must be prepared for a retake by studying or practicing. The singing or written test may be different. Singing example: a different excerpt from the music that allows student to demonstrate the same skill. Written example: different questions that allows student to demonstrate the same skill. Retakes must be completed within two weeks of the original due date.

Make-up Work

Make-up work for an assignment that was due on the missed class day will be due the next class period.
Assessments that are missed will be made up on the next class period.
