### Homework

There is very little homework assigned for this class. Most homework consists of finishing classwork, reading in preparation for class, studying for upcoming tests or quizzes, or finalizing written assignments or presentations. So that students can fully participate, it is imperative that homework is completed. Homework will not count more than 10% of a student's overall grade.

### Late Work

All missed work must be completed within two days of your return. It is your responsibility to find out what you missed if you are absent. You should check the Make-up Work Binder, Google Classroom, and/or your peers to find out what you missed and what you need to make-up.

### Explanation of Zeroes

Students may receive zeroes for gradebook assignments that are never submitted or for assignments that are submitted but result in no correct answers or responses. Students receiving zeroes will have opportunities for revision, including but not limited to the opportunities described in the section above.

### Reassessment

Students who have not been successful on a summative assessment will be offered an option for academic recovery, with the exception of reading assessments at the teacher's discretion. Students who choose to redo an assignment must schedule an appointment with Mr. Schwartz to discuss remediation and reassessment. The discussion and new assessment must be completed within two weeks after a graded assessment is returned. On a reassessment, a student can earn up to an 86.

### Make-up Work

If you missed a test or quiz, be prepared to take it the day of your return. If an assignment has been assigned prior to an absence, you are still required to adhere to the assigned due date. It is a good idea to have the contact information of a responsible classmate you can call when you are absent. In the case of extended absences, please see the teacher regarding make-up work. Discretion on make-up work for unexcused absences is left up to the teacher.

## Extra Credit

Extra credit may be assigned at the teacher's discretion. Every extra credit assignment will serve a classroom purpose for advancing student understanding of a given curriculum topic, facilitating student reflection, or forming real world connections to the material that may otherwise be too time consuming to complete during a regular school day.
